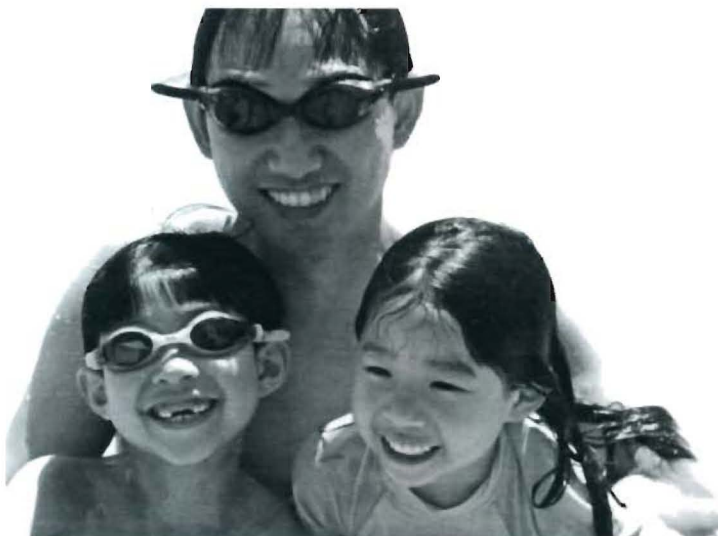

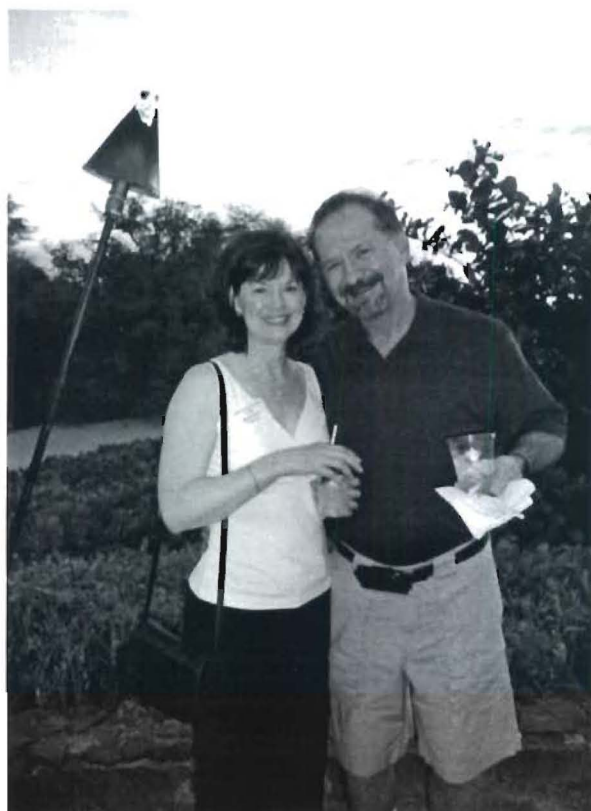

Message from UW Department Chair Greg Huang

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

It has been a busy, exciting, and challenging year.

The Challenges - some expected, and others, not

On the expected side, Washington State's revenues were hit hard by the economic downturn, resulting in a significant impact on the State's ability to support higher education. This translated into a 25% reduction in state funding for the University of Washington, with some of this shortfall being offset by raising tuition rates for students. Even with the tuition hikes, though, state funding is 10 -15% less for most UW schools and departments during the current biennium. For all of us at the University, the current situation forces us to do more with less. However, this challenge has provided us with a unique opportunity to evaluate the systems and efficiencies in our department, to make some changes in our operations, and to emerge with a renewed sense of energy and focus.

On the unexpected side, we have also had several health challenges this year. As many of you know, Jim Clark, long-time departmental photographer, was diagnosed with ALS this spring. To honor Jim's contributions in photography and digital imaging, he was recognized as a Kokich-Shapiro Lecturer in October, and he gave a wonderful presentation on the history of photography, as well as the history of our department. It was well-attended by faculty, alums, students, and dental school staff, and included many wonderful images and memories from the past 4 decades.

On the same day that Jim was giving his Kokich-Shapiro Lecture, Michele Nucci, our Graduate Program Coordinator, was diagnosed with leukemia. Fortunately, she has received excellent care at the UW Medical Center, the doctors feel that they have eradicated the cancer, and her prognosis appears to be very good. That is all wonderful news to Michele's family, and to us.

Exciting Developments

As many of you are aware, we have been raising monies for a clinic remodel. I am extremely pleased to announce that we are on the verge of making this a reality, as plans are being finalized to start the remodel in January, 2011. This is our first opportunity to remodel since the 1970's, and we are looking forward to redesigning the entry and reception area, as well as adding an "Imaging Center" recognizing Jim Clark. Our vision for this Imaging Center is an area where we can gather digital photographs, perform digital intra-oral scanning, and possibly take conventional and 3-D radiographs. In fact, many of you have already been contacted by Vince, Peter, Don, Bill, and David about donations for this Imaging Center, and your support will be an critical factor in making this center a reality.

This is all REALLY, REALLY EXCITING – A NEW CLINIC !!! I hope each of you will share in this endeavor by making a contribution today. I think every UW alum should consider donating the fees from at least one case, making this our "Case for the Clinic" campaign. Many of you have already donated much more, and we truly thank each and every one of you for your generosity. All donors will be recognized on a special display, and with the help of the UWOAA family, our goal is to showcase the remodeled clinic when everyone gathers in Seattle for our Alumni Reunion in the summer of 2011.

I would also like to share more good news on what has been happening with the Moore-Riedel Endowment. Greg King has held this position for almost five years, and he has utilized resources from this endowment to form a practice-based research network. Organizing this entity has been no small task, and we have been fortunate to have assistance from NORTHWEST Precedent, a federally funded dental research network established initially for general dentists. The orthodontic network is currently involved with two studies, one on temporary anchorage devices, and one on remineralization of white spots. We hope to use this network to continue conducting research on important clinical topics, such as optimal retention regimens, advances with 3-D diagnosis and treatment planning, and effectiveness of various types of orthodontic therapy. This may become one of UW's new legacies – the conduct of clinical research in the actual offices of network clinicians. The idea has great appeal from the standpoint of clinical relevance and generalizability to private practice.

As Greg King's term ends, we have another opportunity - to select the next Moore-Riedel Professor. The Moore-Riedel Professorship was intended to attract a prominent orthodontist/scholar, and we are hopeful that we will be able to recruit a preeminent individual to complement our existing faculty. The Dean and Alumni Association are currently forming a search committee, and we hope to announce the next endowed professor in the next 6 – 8 months.

Finally, one additional achievement should be mentioned. The entire dental school underwent accreditation by the ADA Council on Dental Accreditation in mid-November. This process occurs once every 7 years, and it is an extremely valuable opportunity for each department to critically assess its activities. I am happy to report that the undergraduate and graduate orthodontic programs had a very favorable report from the accreditation team, as did all the programs here at the UW School of Dentistry. Busy times here, and I am sure, for all of you. As the year comes to an end, though, we should thank and appreciate all those who help us, and assist us, and support us. In my case, special thanks to Jim and Michele, for their years of dedicated service. Thanks to all the wonderful, committed faculty and staff in the department. All of you make my job an enjoyable, interesting, and worthwhile adventure. Thanks to the UWOAA and every alumnus of our great program – for your contributions to the mission of our department, and for spreading the UW legacy.


We can proudly look at ourselves as alumni of the University of Washington Orthodontics Department. We number close to 430 since the Department was founded in 1948 in conjunction with the establishment of the Schools of Medicine and Dentistry at the UW. "Drs. Alton W. Moore and Richard A. Riedel served as its Chairmen for...twenty-seven years during which time the Department became the model for orthodontic graduate education and research throughout the world. Central to the principles upon which the Department was founded was the integration of physical, biological and clinical sciences in its research and teaching programs...Drs. Moore and Riedel structured the graduate orthodontic curriculum with the recognition that the program could never presume to provide a complete education, but could only produce a "safe beginner" who was prepared for a professional life of critical analysis and continual learning. The close personal relationships that Al Moore and Dick Riedel fostered among students, faculty members and professional colleagues were central to the Department's success and its far-reaching impact on the orthodontic specialty. Graduate students and junior faculty members were given the freedom to pursue their own interests in a non-competitive, non-hierarchical and mutually supportive environment. This tradition produced a generation of leaders in academic and administrative orthodontics, including over twenty graduates who founded or chaired orthodontic departments worldwide. These precedents have been continued under subsequent Department leadership, positioning the University of Washington Department of Orthodontics to sustain its contributions to academic, investigative and clinical excellence into the twenty-first century."

The UW Orthodontic alumni have maintained a powerful presence in the field of orthodontics. Our graduates have gone on to become leaders in every facet of orthodontics, including national and international department chairs and faculty, presidents of both the ABO and AAO, and journal editors including the prestigious AJO-DO. Our alumni are teaching in dental schools, serving in professional organizations, and lending their skills both locally and abroad. In doing so, we can readily see the principles set forth by Drs. Moore and Riedel and be assured that their legacy is fruitful and strong.

The strength of our organization continues to show through the support the alumni extends to the Department. The Clinic Renovation funds have grown significantly despite recent economic challenges. The Jim Clark Imaging Center fund drive is seeing overwhelming support in honor of Jim's dedication to and impact on the Department. And efforts are underway to seek out the next recipient of the Moore-Riedel Professorship.

So what do we hope to accomplish? The Alumni Board continues to plan and maintain educational fellowship traditions with the alternating Clinical Update and UWOAA Reunion (look to summer of 2011 for the next Reunion!), as well as annual receptions at the PCSO and AAO sessions. Your endowment dollars allow critical financial support to resident research and lend additional support to the varied educational needs of the Department. We will continue to underwrite the outstanding Alton Moore Lectureship and Thesis Day. Newer endeavors include initiating a Mentoring Program for the residents with local Alumni. Over the next few months watch for the launch of a new website as an information resource and to facilitate communication with our Alumni.

Thanks to you, the UW Orthodontic Alumni Association is recognized as being exemplary. The support you provide allows the Department to sustain its academic and investigative contributions as well as its standard of clinical excellence. The Board, *your* board, is proud to represent you and we truly welcome your comments!

CONTRIBUTIONS UPDATE

Your continuous and generous contributions have been the foundation for Association support to the UW Orthodontic Department. Alumni have asked about how their contributions are received and credited by the Association. Here is a brief breakdown:

TYPES OF CONTRIBUTIONS

1. *Contributions to the UW Orthodontic Alumni Association.* Tax deductible checks are made out to the UWOAA and mailed directly to the Association. Credit toward "club" level is given upon receipt of the check. The donation may be directly from an alumnus or on the behalf of an alumnus by another person, such as a referring dentist. The donor receives tax credit and the alumnus receives club credit. The person contributing must indicate the name of the alumni member who should receive credit to their club level. Contact Joni Marts for "In lieu of" forms to facilitate others donating on your behalf.

2. *Contributions directed to specific funds at the UW.* Tax deductible checks are made out to the University of Washington and mailed to the Department of Orthodontics, specifying which fund the monies are to be directed (see below). The Fund Development Office then receives and processes these funds for the Department and reports their receipt to the UWOAA. The Association then gives Club credit to the UW alumni contributors. As above, another individual may donate on behalf of an alumnus directly to a specified fund and receive the tax deduction. Checks should be sent to the UW Orthodontic Department. Also, the donor should indicate which alumnus should receive credit for club status.

Is someone donating on your behalf?

It's important that we know that so you can receive proper club credit and kudos along the way! Please encourage anyone you know who might be indicating a generous gesture on your behalf to mention your name to us.

CANADIAN DONORS

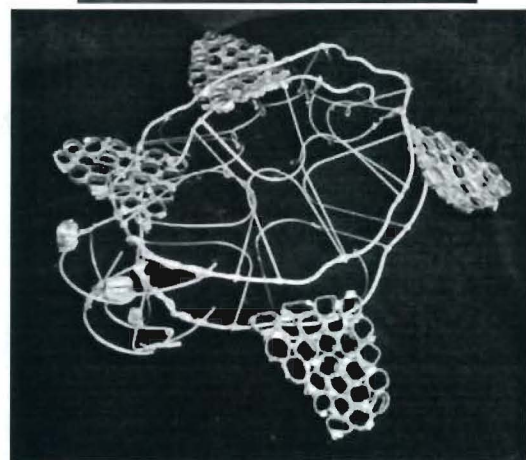
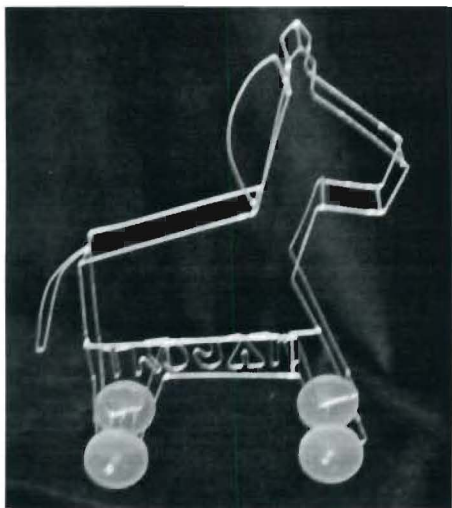
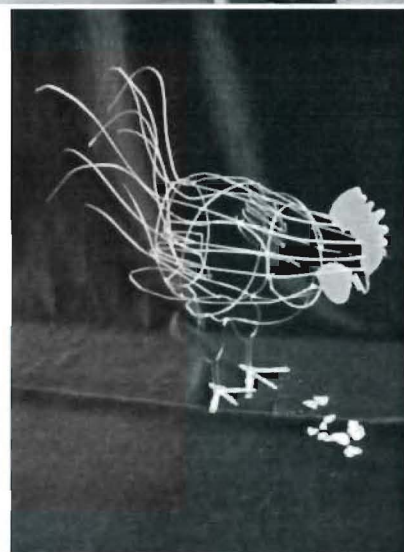
